STEMZ Contest 2017 – October 21, 2017

The Scarborough Chapter of Professional Engineers of Ontario (PEOSC) is conducting the second annual **STEMZ** competition for Scarborough high school students (Grades 9 -12). This exciting contest involves:

1. an Educational component to enhance students' knowledge of **Science, Technology, Engineering, Math** and all eZe and
2. a Contest, to prepare students as good future citizens.

The STEMZ program will also cover areas of Art, Finance, Business, Sports, Health and other areas where Math and Science play vital roles.

PEOSC will conduct the contest on Saturday, October 21, 2017 in order to enhance the engineering profession educational outreach and to improve the student's interest and performance towards STEM. The contest will be based on articles published in the Scarborough Chapter Website. Students will read, understand the articles and sample Q&As for the preparation of the STEMZ Contest.

Registration is for individual students and will be on "first come first served" basis. We will allow the first 60 students for each Level (Juniors Level- Grade 9 & 10, and Seniors Level - Grade 11 & 12) to register. The rest of the students will be kept on a waiting list.
